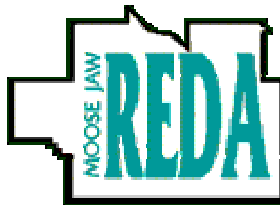

The Village of Pense has a population of nearly 600 and celebrated its 100th Anniversary in 2004. It is centrally located in the Regina-Moose Jaw Corridor, and is an ideal location for new businesses and commuters as it provides a secure, lower-cost alternative to nearby cities.

Streets are well maintained throughout the seasons with grading, gravelling, and snow plowing and removal, despite being unpaved. We have a full service Post Office, and also a Town Hall which hosts social functions such as Dinner Theatre, Fashion Show, and school concerts and Awards nights.

Accommodation is provided by the Pense Hotel, which features catering and a licensed bar/restaurant. A local gathering spot is the Pense Food Store and Gas Bar, offering basic food staples, fresh homemade baking, coffee shop, and gasoline sales. Wayne's Place sells wine and spirits and provides movie rentals. Good Insurance provides insurance and financial service to the Village. Other businesses provide auto repair and towing, reflexology, hair salon, massage therapy/tanning/spa, country crafts, trucking, sub-contracting, electrical, and snow removal.

The Village of Pense offers a wide variety of activities to every age in the community. Past activities include golf clinics, bike safety courses, craft classes, summer fun programs for youth, and an Easter Break program for girls called 'Girls on the Move'. Subsequently a boys program was also developed called 'Guys on the Go'. The Pense Rebels is a softball team for women 18 and over, which plays two games per week in a competitive league from May to June.

The Pense Recreation Board also sponsors the Danstastics Club, which teaches a variety of competitive dance including jazz and hip hop; the Figure Skating Club; Seniors Inc., a group aimed at older citizens of Pense that meets Thursday afternoons for activities ranging from Cribbage to Pool; Ketto Ryu Ju Jutsu; Pense School; Pense Playschool; and Pense Sled Runners Inc. Snowmobile Club. The Booster Club is responsible for minor hockey in Pense with levels of Initiation, Novice, Atom, Pee Wee, and Bantam.

Volunteers make up the Pense Curling Club, offering Junior (grades 4-6), Youth (Grades 7-8) and Adult Leagues. An annual OPENSPIEL is held at the start of each season, followed by a FUNSPIEL in January and Canteen Appreciation Spiel in early March. A FAMILY FUNSPIEL has also been proposed between Christmas and New Year.

The Rural Municipality (RM) of Pense (No. 160) is located between the Provincial Capital of Regina and the City of Moose Jaw along the TransCanada Highway (#1). The RM location includes townships 16, 17, 18; Ranges 22, 23, 24 west of the second meridian. There are over 600 kilometres (kms) of roads within the RM and both the CN and CP rail lines run through the RM. The RM has approximately 400 residents in addition to those residing in the Villages of Belle Plaine and Pense. The RM of Pense also provides services to the Hamlets of Keystown and Stony Beach.

The first municipal organization within the boundaries of the present municipality was formed in 1897 and consisted of one township Local Improvement Districts (L.I.D.s). Ratepayers decided at annual meetings what needed to be done. An overseer was hired to do the work. Taxes were levied to pay for the work. Ratepayers could pay their taxes by performing day labour.

In 1904 the L.I.D.s were replaced with larger L.I.D.s organized under the L.I.D. Ordinance of 1903. Four townships were included in this L.I.D. One councillor was elected for each township. On December 12, 1909, L.I.D. Number 160 was incorporated. The first Reeve was H. McGillivray. Council members included: E. Badley, R. Bigham, T. Aitkins, J. McRae, W. Badley, and J. Cafferata.

Agriculture is the primary industry in the RM of Pense. Wheat, durum, oats, and barley are all grown here. Oilseeds such as flax, canola, and mustard are grown and pulse crops such as lentils and chickpeas are produced in the RM as well.

Major industry in the RM of Pense includes Mosaic Potash, Yara Belle Plaine Inc. (formerly Saskferco), and Canadian Salt. Mosaic Potash is one of the world's largest producers of potash. Saskferco Products Inc. is one of the top producers in the world of urea fertilizer and anhydrous ammonia. Canadian Salt Co. Ltd. produces salt products near the Village of Belle Plaine. Terra Grain Fuels is a major ethanol plant within the R.M.'s industrial district. The 150 million-litre facility became operational in mid 2008.

The Nicole Flats Nature Area (Buffalo Pound Provincial Park) provides a chance to enjoy nature by hiking through beautiful scenery of Buffalo Pound Provincial Park.

Recreation facilities include: skating rink, ball diamonds, curling rink, playground, and water park.

The RM of Pense has excellent access to healthcare facilities in Moose Jaw and Regina.

Schools in the area reside in Pense, Grand Coulee, Lumsden, Regina, and Moose Jaw.

Emergency services include a local modern volunteer fire department, police services from the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP), and First Responders.

The Village of Belle Plaine is situated on the TransCanada Highway #1 and the Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR) Mainline, approximately halfway between the cities of Moose Jaw and Regina. There are over 80 residents living in the community.

Some say Belle Plaine was named by early settlers after Belle Plaine Iowa, USA. Others say it was named by a Frenchman on the CPR construction crew. Translated literally it means 'Beautiful Plain'. The Homesteaders were the first settlers in the district arriving in 1883 and 1884. By 1905, most of the available homestead lands had been occupied. Most of the settlers bought their land from the CPR and the companies such as Luseland Company Calgary, Medicine Hat Land Company, and Canadian Northwest Land Company.

The earliest record of Belle Plaine indicated that the Western Elevator Company was operating here in 1899, but as Stony Beach farmers were hauling wheat to Belle Plaine in 1896 it was likely that there was an elevator operating at that time. The post office opened in 1903 and the church was built that same year. Belle Plaine held its first sports day in 1902. The CPR station was built in 1908 and the Bank of Hamilton operated from 1908 to 1916. In the early days Belle Plaine had many granaries. Farmers filled them in the fall when weather and roads were good and loaded them out in winter when railway cars became available.

Most of the population of Belle Plaine work outside the community in nearby industries such as Mosaic, Yara Belle Plaine Inc. (formerly Saskferco), and Canadian Salt. Belle Plaine has been endorsed by the cities of Moose Jaw and Regina as an important link in the industrial development corridor. Businesses within Belle Plaine include Chubby's 2000, Wilderman Mechanical and Backhoe, Second Hand Rose Auto Restoration, GDS Manufacturing, and Prairie House of Memories.

Belle Plaine is an important link between Moose Jaw and Regina. The community has a motel, gas station, lounge and restaurant.

Belle Plaine has a ball diamond, outdoor skating rink, and an active town hall for meetings and other engagements.

The Craft Shop with antiques and featuring the history of the community offers culture to the residents of Belle Plaine and travelers coming through the Village.

The Rural Municipality (RM) of Pense (No. 160) is located between the Provincial Capital of Regina and the City of Moose Jaw along the TransCanada Highway (#1). The RM location includes townships 16, 17, 18; Ranges 22, 23, 24 west of the second meridian. There are over 600 kilometres (kms) of roads within the RM and both the CN and CP rail lines run through the RM. The RM has approximately 400 residents in addition to those residing in the Villages of Belle Plaine and Pense. The RM of Pense also provides services to the Hamlets of Keystown and Stony Beach.

The first municipal organization within the boundaries of the present municipality was formed in 1897 and consisted of one township Local Improvement Districts (L.I.D.s). Ratepayers decided at annual meetings what needed to be done. An overseer was hired to do the work. Taxes were levied to pay for the work. Ratepayers could pay their taxes by performing day labour.

In 1904 the L.I.D.s were replaced with larger L.I.D.s organized under the L.I.D. Ordinance of 1903. Four townships were included in this L.I.D. One councillor was elected for each township. On December 12, 1909, L.I.D. Number 160 was incorporated. The first Reeve was H. McGillivray. Council members included: E. Badley, R. Bigham, T. Aitkins, J. McRae, W. Badley, and J. Cafferata.

Agriculture is the primary industry in the RM of Pense. Wheat, durum, oats, and barley are all grown here. Oilseeds such as flax, canola, and mustard are grown and pulse crops such as lentils and chickpeas are produced in the RM as well.

Major industry in the RM of Pense includes Mosaic Potash, Yara Belle Plaine Inc. (formerly Saskferco), and Canadian Salt. Mosaic Potash is one of the world's largest producers of potash. Saskferco Products Inc. is one of the top producers in the world of urea fertilizer and anhydrous ammonia. Canadian Salt Co. Ltd. produces salt products near the Village of Belle Plaine. Terra Grain Fuels is a major ethanol plant within the R.M.'s industrial district. The 150 million-litre facility became operational in mid 2008.

The Nicole Flats Nature Area (Buffalo Pound Provincial Park) provides a chance to enjoy nature by hiking through beautiful scenery of Buffalo Pound Provincial Park.

Recreation facilities include: skating rink, ball diamonds, curling rink, playground, and water park.

The RM of Pense has excellent access to healthcare facilities in Moose Jaw and Regina.

Schools in the area reside in Pense, Grand Coulee, Lumsden, Regina, and Moose Jaw.

Emergency services include a local modern volunteer fire department, police services from the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP), and First Responders.
